In 2012 more than one million children in Florida under age 18 lived in poverty; a 44.6% increase since 2002.



Nearly 60% of students in Florida in 2012 were eligible for the free/reduced lunch program; a 31.4% increase since 2002.





53.9% of mothers giving birth participated in the WIC food and nutrition program in 2012; a 22.2% increase since 2004*.
